Innovation Grant -Supportive Services to Library Patrons

Late last year, CLUSTER was pleased to learn that we would be a partner recipient of an Innovation Grant. CLUSTER, Inc. is partnering with Yonkers Public Library to connect professional case managers with patrons in one-on-one consultations at the library. The case managers will work onsite two days a week at the

Riverfront and Will libraries. They will provide information and referral services that help address a variety of needs for individuals, including entitlement benefits, housing insecurity, substance abuse, and physical and mental health.

Librarians at both sites face many questions and information requests from patrons on topics outside their area of expertise. Having case managers proficient in a wide range of areas such as mental health care, housing, benefits advocacy, and other social services areas – will be a huge benefit, both to the patron and the librarians. The library offers a safe and discreet place for people from all backgrounds, all ages, genders and social level to seek guidance on very sensitive subjects, without any risk of embarrassment or judgement.

CLUSTER Welcomes *Rev. Winfield Peacock*

Rev. Winfield Peacock has recently become CLUSTER's newest member of the Board of Directors. Rev. Peacock is the Pastor at Bryn Mawr Park Presbyterian Church. Prior to becoming the Pastor, at Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church,

he was the Executive Director at John Heuss House in New York City, where he worked to rehouse thousands of chronically homeless, mentally ill and medically frail individuals. Rev. Peacock received his Bachelor of Arts in Religion from Drew University and his Master of Divinity

from Union Theological Seminary in New York City. Rev. Peacock will serve on CLUSTER's Finance Committee.

Receives Eviction Prevention Grant

CLUSTER has been awarded an Eviction Prevention contract through Westchester Department of Social Services to serve over 900 Westchester residents in Yonkers and Mount Vernon (including Mt. Vernon, Bronxville, Pelham, Pelham Manor, New Rochelle). This five year contract will focus on providing support to individuals and families by preserving their homes when they are at risk of becoming homeless. CLUSTER will accept and review referrals and applications for rental assistance, security deposits, utility assistance and/or moving allowances from residents from those catchment areas. Residents must provide a written denial or intention to pay letter from DSS and acceptable proof that homelessness is imminent, and that the household has the resources needed to sustain their housing situation after the emergency assistance is provided.

Tajae Gaynor, Director for the Westchester and Rockland Mediation Center stated, "We anticipate that this Eviction Prevention contract will allow us to fulfill our mission as we continue to support families and individuals in Westchester County resolve their immediate housing issue(s) and achieve self-sufficiency".
