On June 8th 4 CLUSTER participants graduated from the Diabetes Self-Management Program. These workshops are facilitated by CLUSTER in collaboration with Westchester Medical Center Performing Provider System (WMCPPS). Participants attended the workshops two and one half days per week for six weeks.

Individuals with Type 2 diabetes participated in this interactive workshop to learn how they could help manage their illness and maintain their blood sugar in a healthy range. Participants learn portion control by following recommendations from the American Diabetes Association (ADA) on healthy eating. They also learn the importance of exercising, reading food labels and counting carbs, fats, and sugar in foods.

We will be conducting more Diabetes workshops throughout the year, with the next one starting in mid-July. Everyone is welcome to attend and can recommend the workshops to others who may benefit from attending.
