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Haub Law's Initial Mediation Training introduces participants to the practice of mediation. The training will be led by experts in the field.

The training will explore the basics of ADR and negotiation before learning the theory and skills associated with mediation. Through lecture, discussion, exercises, and simulations, participants will gain an understanding of the skills needed to become a mediator.

This training is approved under Part 146 by the New York State Unified Court System's Office of ADR Program and satisfies Part 146 requirements, with at least 24 hours of initial mediation training.

Note: Placement on any court roster is at the discretion of the local Administrative Judge and participation in a course that is approved does not guarantee placement on a local court roster. Pursuant to Part 146, court-based mediation rosters require both a combination of mediation training and experience mediating. In addition, some courts may require additional training and experience beyond Part 146's requirements. Acceptance on court rosters depends on a court's need for mediators at any given time and may include a court's need for mediators with specific casetype training or experience.
